FROM THE MINISTER'S DESK

Facing the most challenging moment in His life, Jesus urged His disciples to rise and go with Him. *Matthew* 26: 46. To where did Jesus call them? The thick cloud of uncertainty must have darkened their hearts.

If you have money in the bank, in your wallet, and spare change in a dish someplace, you are among the top 8% of the world's wealthy.


If your parents are still married and alive, you are very rare, especially in the United States.

During the summer of 1936, the Rodcheaver School of Music was in session at Winona Lake Bible Conference, and "Rody" invited all the faculty members to Rainbow Point for the evening. Among them were the well known Christian musicians, Virgil Brock and his wife, Blanche Kerr Brock. On this particular evening, the sunset was fabulous. As the faculty members talked about the splendour of the setting sun against the lake, one of them—a blind man named Horace Burr, Virgil's cousin—exclaimed, "My, that sure is a wonderful sunset. Thanks so much for picturing it for me. I would have missed a lot if you folks hadn't been here to describe it." When someone commented on Horace's "seeing," he replied, "I can see. I see through other people's eyes, and I think I often see more, I see beyond the sunset." By and by the conversation shifted to the subject of heaven. Someone asked if we can really visualize what lies beyond death's door. Recalling Horace's words, Virgil replied, "Horace Burr has never seen the glory of an earthly sunset, yet was blessed as we tried to describe it to him. In the same we, as Christians, have never seen what is beyond, but God in His love and promise has told us in the bible of the glory that is awaiting us beyond the sunset." Back in their own lodgings later that evening, Virgil and Blanche relived the evening. Sitting down together at an old piano, they began putting together words and music. "To us it seemed as if a bright light of truth had streamed into our hearts and lives and had become a song," Virgil later said. The song was completed that evening and dedicated to Horace and Grace Burr.

Beyond the sunset, O blissful morning, When with our Saviour heav'n is begun; Earth's toiling ended, O glorious dawning -Beyond the sunset when day is done.
